Col. Alfred Reese, said that he was the one who had spoken to some of the Women's Welsh Club members and what he said to them was that Gwyneth had accepted the change reluctantly.

President Lewis, asked Gwyneth, to please extend the necessary apology.

Mary Davis, from Milwaukee has requested help with the WAY membership drive. We have agreed to help.

President Lewis, called on Gwyneth Crysler, National President of Welsh Women's Clubs of America, sponsors of the Welsh Home for the Aged, in Rocky River, Ohio. Gwyneth, reported that the Gymanfa which was held at the home, was a huge success. She was quite disappointed, that more W.N.G.G.A. representatives were unable to attend and extended the invitation to come and tour the home. The sponsoring clubs are quite proud of this beautiful home for the aged.

N.W.A.F. representative, James Martin spoke a word to the Board, encouraging help for the oil spill in Wales.

President Lewis, called on Phillips Davies for the Scholarship and Grants Committee report. Copies of this report were distributed and read. Phillips, reported that articles were sent to both Welsh newspapers. Jack Lewis, thanked Phillips for his hard work and mentioned that Phillips, will be working on the creation of a new form to be used by the committee.

Audit Report, given by Nelson Llewellyn.

Auditors Jason Moore and Robert Penry have submitted a very thorough written report. Copies available. They did locate a discrepancy with the Endowment Fund. Paul Stevens was contacted and he explained that this is due to the difference in the value of the investments. The Auditors, report that our 501C3 status had been clarified. The Auditors, have also suggested bonding for the Treasurer, Secretary, Executive Director and Endowment Chairman. A policy has been taken. The cost is an annual fee of \$227.00.

Credentials Committee reported 106 registered.

President Lewis, called on Nominations Chairman, Ellis Jones, for their report. Ellis, explained the nominating procedure and thanked the organizations who submitted names of candidates for the Board of Trustees. Scholarship and Grants Committee report was given by Phillips Davies. As of the deadline for this year, there were a total of ten formal applications for funding by individuals and two applications by language teaching groups. Between thirty and forty requests for applications had been received. The following groups and individuals were funded with the usual ten percent deduction withheld until the project was completed. Phillips Davies, thanked the two members of his committee, Myfanwy Davies, and Megan Lloyd. He also thanked Paul Stevens for overseeing the funds and writing checks to recipients.

Arvel Steece, requested the floor to voice two concerns. The first being the (W.N.G.G.A.) relationship with the Hymn Society of the United States and Canada. The second is the concern about Christian music. What can we do to encourage the treasures of Welsh hymns? Director Llewellyn, stated that W.N.G.G.A. has submitted two copies of the reformatted hymnal to the National Hymn Society. As of this date, we have not heard from them. President Lewis, stated the boards awareness of the second concern.

Al Reese, Trustee and editor of HWYL issued a plea for any information anyone may have concerning the W.N.G.G.A. prior to 1983. He assured everyone that any information loaned will be returned. In order for a history of the W.N.G.G.A. to be written, any information would be greatly appreciated.

Gary Davies, Wisconsin, representing the Milwaukee 1997 steering committee would like to put into the record - in order to promote family participation (especially young people) and to receive participation by those in the educational community, recommends the following recommendations. That effective, by the year 2000 the date of the Welsh National Gymanfa be changed by the board, to a time during the summer, that is non-school time. Second, that the board of W.N.G.G.A. encourage the local committees to consider lower cost venues, such as universities, colleges, and conference grounds. President Lewis, assured the Milwaukee Committee that the board will certainly consider this and thanked them.

Endowment Report was reviewed by Nelson Llewellyn. Due to Paul Stevens, absence a copy of the report was given to each member to review. A copy of the Auditors report was read. A motion was made by Nelson Llewellyn, to accept the report. Second by Gladys Williams. Motion passed.

Director Llewellyn, nominated Robert Penry of Columbus, Ohio and Jason Moore of Warren, Ohio as the auditors, for fiscal year, August 1, 1996 to July 31, 1997. Alice Deisroth second. Membership moved to accept.

Tom Edwards, advised the W.N.G.G.A. to continue to support the Eisteddfod and noted that six bards were present here today. President Lewis, had the six bards stand for applause. Tom Edwards moved to make a resolution to continue our support of the Eisteddfod. Cerwyn Davies, second. Motion passed.

Don Mills, reported on the folk song book, Songs of the Dragon. He encouraged us to use these books and to encourage others to use them. He encourages the use of these in our programs so people will be aware of them. Alice Deisroth, suggested

purchasing these books and giving them for gifts. She noted both the folk book and the hymn book make wonderful gifts.

Nelson Llewellyn, mentioned that he needs everyone to help in regard to a serious matter. Changes in addresses are needed so the files can be updated. This is causing added expense with the mailing. Also, please give updates on organizations.

Myfanwy Davies, made a motion the ballots for the trustee election be destroyed. Al Reese, second. Passed.

Cerwyn Davies, reminded us how for the past two years, we have had the tremendous pleasure of sitting under the chairmanship of Jack Lewis. His term is almost to an end, this being his last annual meeting. Therefore, we must thank him very much for a job well done. The membership honored President Lewis, with much applause. President Lewis, thanked everyone.

## EXECUTIVE DIRECTORS ANNUAL REPORT

August 30, 1996

TO: The Officers, Board of Trustees and Members of The Welsh National Gymanfa Ganu Association, Inc.

Activity of your Executive Director and the WNGGA office has been varied and an exceptionally busy year. Following are some of the highlights.

A very important duty is the communication with venue committees and on sight meetings with the committees. Visits were made to; Milwaukee in October 1995, Milwaukee in June 1996, Columbus in August 1995 and June 1996.

Attended our midyear board meeting at Niagara Falls, Ontario in April 1996 and enjoyed a delightful weekend with the OGGA folks.

In addition to processing the usual heavy volume of membership and other communication, two mailings of our news letter "HWYL" were made in January and June 1996. A letter was mailed in January 1996 to Annual Members notifying them of the need to renew their membership. Two mailings were made for the Utica venue committee. The first in March (5,000 pieces), the second in June 1996 (2,500 pieces). In order to draw attention to the renewal of WAY activity, we included a flyer in the second mailing.

During the year the copyright for our **REFORMATTED HYMNAL** was obtained, thanks to Ellis Jones for his assistance.

Our Federal 501 c 3 status has been questioned for some years and this status has now been clarified, thanks to Attorney Paul E. Stevens for his assistance.

In order to follow up with suggestions from our auditors Robert Penry and Jason Moore it was necessary to consult with the firm of Hill, Garth and King of Youngstown regarding filing with the Federal Government. Also, the matter of bonding for the Treasurer, Secretary, Executive Director and Endowment Chairman as suggested by the auditors is now in place. Bonding coverage was obtained at an annual cost of \$270.00 for three years ending in 1999.

Cost of our corporate insurance police continues to increase each year. By expressing our concern to The Richland-Knowles Agency, a credit of \$270.00 was realized.

Executive Directors Report  
August 20, 1996

The membership status report prepared for the board indicates a slight increase in total membership of 53 (2.1%), 1.7% in US and 1.1% in Canada.

Sale of the 1995 Reformatted Hymnal was extremely brisk having sold 2,244 of the 5,000 printed, leaving 2,244 in stock. A few 1979 Hymnals were sold and 600 remain in stock. Less than 100 Welsh Folk Song Books were sold with 845 remaining in stock.

Part time clerical help in the office has been a great help and has stayed within the budget. At present the part time hours is adequate.

Mr. President, this report gives you some idea as to the activity of our office. I thank The Welsh National Gymanfa Ganu Association Officers, Trustees and Members for the privilege of serving and move this report be accepted. Diolch Yn Fawr!
