Dear Gwynn,

Thank you for your letter of July 11 in which you advise that you have written to Mary Griswold advising her of what has transpired in Chicago.

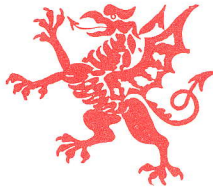

I hope that you enjoyed yourself while in Chicago. I know that I did. Both Edna and I always enjoy going there because they have such a good Gymanfa Ganu.

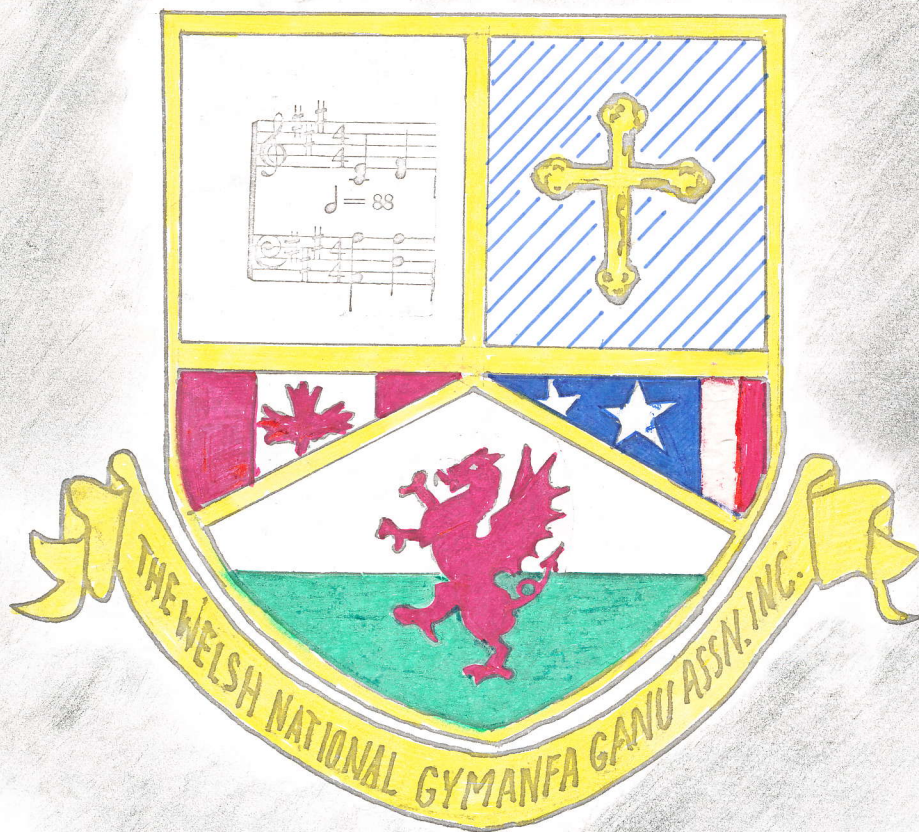
If there's anything that you want me to do between now and September please don't hesitate to let me know.
