Dear Lewis:

Thank you for your letter and the order for Hymnals.

You stated in your letter that you had been elected as a three year Trustee and not the unexpired two year term.

Regarding your question, I asked the Recording Secretary Emmaline Davies to check her notes and the recorded tape. Emmaline has informed me that her records indicate the voting results for three Canada nominees were explained as follows: Two nominees receiving the higher number of votes would serve full three year terms and the third nominee would fill the unexpired term of two years left vacant by Gwenfyl Jone's elevation to V. President the previous year. The tellers did in fact report your name to be the third in line, thus the two year term.

At the time I issued the listing of Officer & Trustees, my understanding was as explained above. Please advise if you have information to the contrary.

The 120 Hymnals you requested for the Ontario Gymanfa Ganu Association will be mailed this week in three packages. Please let me know when you receive them. Cost of the Hymnals will be \$360.00 Plus postage of \$35.22 for a total of \$395.22 U. S. Currency. 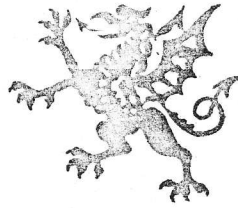


