### Rates

### Function Rooms

However, before applying charges, the number of sleeping rooms utilized, the amount of food and beverage functions, and the type of set-ups utilized will all be taken into consideration.

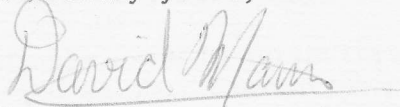
Reservation Cards

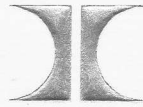

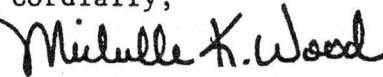
