Minutes of meeting held at Pittsburgh, Pa. September 4, 1938

The meeting was called to order by President George Hopkins at 10.15 A.M. and the following named officers were present- Treasurer W. B. Jones, Vice President Caradoc Ellis and Secretary George Bundy. Mr. R.H. Davies Second Vice-President was absent on account illness and the secretary was instructed to send Mr. Davies, message or regret.

The minutes of the last meeting were read and approved.

President Hopkins appointed Caradoc Ellis and Wm. E. Morgan, a committee on credentials and they reported 36 Societies represented. The report of the Credentials committee was adopted and the delegates were seated.

It was moved, seconded and carried "That all past officers of the association be seated as regular delegates." Mr. Geo, D. Rees of Chicago was seated and Past Presidents E. Elythin and E.B. Williams were present as regular delegates.

The report of the Johnstown Committee was read, showing that the 1937 National was a success in every way. The sum of \$237.86, had been turned over to the ~~Nat~~ National Treasurer. A unanimous vote of thanks was accorded to the Johnstown Committee.

President Hopkins reported, several cities had been visited in the interest of the Association.

The absence of the Union Labor from the 1938 edition of Favorite Hymns was noted, and the Pittsburgh delegate assured us that the Gwyer Shep was O,K,

The Report of the Pittsburgh sponsoring committee was presented by Mr. Wm. E. Morgan, which showed everything ready for the Tenth Annual Gymanfa Ganu.

A motion to adopt all reports with a vote of thanks to all, was carried.

President Hopkins called for amendments to the By-Laws and Mr. E. B. Williams moved, and Mr. S. anley Harries seconded "That this association shall be known as The National Gymánfa Ganu Association of the United States and Canada, Inc." Mr. W. B. Jones moved and Mr. John R. Jones, seconded an amendment to the motion which read "That a committee be appointed to look into the matter of Incorporation and report to the N.E.C. in six months hence." The motion was lost and the amendment carried. President Hopkins appointed Messrs E, Elythin, Geo. D. Rees of Chicago and Mr. Leslie Rees of Pittsburgh to investigate the feasibility of incorporation.

NATIONAL GYMANFA GANU ASSOCIATION OF THE UNITED STATES AND CANADA

Minutes of the Pittsburgh 1938 meeting Concluded

Mrs. Gwen T. Williams moved and Mr. W. Bevan seconded "That the name of the Association be changed to International Gymanfa Ganu Association". An amendment to the motion was made and carried "That this matter be referred to the committee on Incorporation".

The secretary submitted the following amendment to the By-Laws. "That the number of Vice-Presidents be increased from two to three, one of whom shall be a resident of Canada." The amendment was carried and President Hopkins, in conjunction with the N. E. C. was authorized to name the Vice President from Canada.

A motion "That the time of the Annual meeting be held at 4.30 P.M. was lost.

Secretary Bundy read a letter from Mr. William Evans, "Ap Cennen" of San Francisco, which asked the delegates assembled, to allow the holding of Two Nationals in 1939. It was properly moved, seconded and carried "That the Welsh people of the Pacific Coast be allowed to hold a National Gymanfa Ganu in 1939, to be known as The Western Division National, and provided the date of the Western does not conflict with that of the regular National- the Sunday before Labor Day."

The present Music Committee- Messrs Geo, Brown, Youngstown, John Lloyd Jones, Johnstown, Pa. and Gwilyn Anwyl, of Wilkes-Barre, Pa., were voted in office for another year.

The next order of business was the selection of the venue for 1939. The bid of New York, presented in 1936 was taken from the table. Bids from Buffalo and Canton, Ohio, were presented by their respective delegates. President Hopkins read letters from the Canton Chamber of Commerce and Mayor Secombe, extending a warm welcome to the association to meet in Canton in 1939.

After some exchange of opinions, the Canton withdrew their bid in favor of Buffalo, and a unanimous vote decided that the 11th Annual National Gymanfa Ganu will be held in Buffalo, N.Y. Sunday September 3, 1939.

At 12:30 P.M. the meeting was adjourned.
