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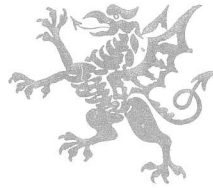

Item #15 on Page 3 of the minutes of the Board of Trustees meeting held in Chicago on Friday, September 1, 1972 lists 6 letters (numbered a to f) which were read and discussed briefly at the meeting.

- (a) Mrs. Alfred C. Jones - that a Parliamentarian not be appointed at this time. I so advised Mrs. Jones.
 - (d) Tregelles Williams - B. B. C. Informative only - no action required. See my letter March 1, 1972 to Mr. Williams.
 - (e) Price L. Jones - it was my impression that the Board felt that the W. N. G. G. A. should confine its efforts to National Gymanfa affairs only, and should not become involved in other Welsh affairs on a national basis. However, I do feel that this was a very interesting letter.
 - (f) Gwynn Parri - W. N. G. G. A. emblem. There did not seem to be much interest, and very little discussion on this matter. You may wish to bring it up again if you think it has merit.

It is my thought that these letters properly belong in your file.

Item 15 on page 3 of the minutes of the Board of Trustees Meeting held in Chicago on Friday, September 1, 1972 is a list of six letters (numbered a to f). These letters were read and discussed briefly at the meeting.

Because no further action was required on four of the letters (a, d, e, and f) I forwarded them to Mr. Meadows for his file with my letter of February 19, 1973.

Letters b and c do require further consideration by you, the N. E. C. and the Board and I am enclosing them herewith.

Letter (b) - From W. Irving Davies, dated August 2, 1972 to the President, Officers, Trustees and members of the W. N. G. G. A. Attached to the letter is a resolution which Mr. Davies requested be placed before the Annual Meeting in Chicago. Because the letter was not received more than 30 days prior to the Chicago meeting it could not be acted upon at that time. It is now a proper matter for the attention of the N. E. C., the Board, and the membership.

Letter (c) - From Mrs. Jean Williams Steinlein on behalf of the Chicago Committee was presented to the Annual Meeting and is covered by item #18 in the minutes of the meeting. The last paragraph in item #18 (on page 5) covers the motion which carried.

While not a part of the motion you will note that during discussion Mrs. Steinlein suggested that the National Committee should select the Headquarters Hotel, and that the Sponsoring Committee take over the details from there.

Judging by the tone of these letters it would appear that there is a need for the W. N. G. G. A. to consider ways and means to exercise more control over the actions of a Sponsoring Committee.

Roy Schubert in his letter of February 15 had some suggestions.

Jack Meadows letter of January 27 indicates real concern in the matter.

MINUTES OF THE ANNUAL MEETING OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE OF THE WELSH NATIONAL
GYMANFA GANU ASSOCIATION, INC., HELD AT CHICAGO, ILLINOIS, ON THURSDAY, AUGUST
31, 1972 AT 3:00 P. M.

1. Mr. Emlyn Lloyd called the meeting of the Executive Committee to discuss several items that will be brought up at the Board of Trustees meeting and the Annual Meeting.
2. President reported on the change that was made by the Executive Committee to hold the next National Gymanfa Ganu in Toronto instead of St. Catharine. Upon a visit to St. Catharine by the committee they found that the necessary accommodations to hold a National Gymanfa Ganu were not available. A further report on this will be made on Friday at the Trustee's meeting.
3. The following were named to be on the nominating committee by the President:

Dr. D. L. Mandry, Chairman
Norman Williams
Ben Haddock
Jack Meadows
Eluned Thomas

The terms of Wynne Price, Rev. Aeron Davies, Ada Thomas and Ann D. Thomas are expiring, consequently two are needed from Canada, two from the Western States and four from the Eastern States.

Mr. John Roberts commented that the time has come for new blood and younger members for these positions.

4. Mr. D. J. Evans, a representative from the Wales Tourist Board attended the meeting and presented the plans that have been made for the Gymanfa Ganu in Swansea in 1974. The program provided accommodations, breakfast, lunch, tea/dinner, transport for official activities, including social programme; gratuities and in the case of those staying for the sightseeing tours and Bisteddfod visit, transport costs.

Air travel to Wales is not included, this to be taken care of by the individual person.

Mr. Evans stated that he has an ample supply of brochures and Mrs. Evans and himself would be available for any information concerning this trip during this session.

Mr. Emlyn Lloyd and the committee were very favorable to the programme presented and asked Mr. Evans to attend the Trustee's meeting on Friday and the annual meeting on Saturday to again present this programme.

The President informed Mr. Evans about the Centennial to be held at Philadelphia in 1976 and suggested that the Welsh people should consider making a trip to the United States for this occasion as the Welsh have played a very strong part in the signing of the Declaration of Independence. Mr. Evans seemed quite pleased and said he would do everything in his power to bring a group from Wales for this centennial. At this time Mr. Evans left the meeting.

5. The President appointed Mr. Obie Cobley as Chairman of the Credentials Committee and stated that he is to select his own committee.
6. The next order of business was the financial report submitted by the Salt Lake City sponsoring committee.

Mr. Emlyn Lloyd reported that this report was not as accurate as reports of this kind should be. Various setbacks seemed to have complicated matters at Salt Lake City during their sessions. President further stated that due to these situations the local committee should definitely abide by the wishes and dictates of the National Gymanfa Ganu committee. He suggested that we accept this report when it is given but in the future the sponsoring committee should work together with the National Gymanfa Ganu committee and accept their guidance.

7. President reported that Mrs. Ann Davies Thomas had sent letters out concerning the new hymnals and due to the high expense of a new hymnal at this time, which could become a large project, he felt this should be tabled.
8. An up to date "Rules and Regulations to the Sponsoring Organization" was given to each member to look over. This will be presented before the Board of Trustees.
9. The following letters were received to be presented:

- (a) From Mrs. Alfred C. Jones - She stated that she did not approve of the way the by-laws were handled at the annual meeting at Salt Lake City. As a parliamentarian she offered her services for the Welsh National Gymanfa Ganu Association.

The President stated that it would be up to the board if they would want a parliamentarian.

- (b) From W. Irving Davies - He suggested that the National Gymanfa Ganu Committee should play a more prominent role in the sponsoring of these Nationals, they should be the sole sponsors of these events.

As this letter was not received within the thirty day period required by the by-laws, this could not be submitted at this time to the board.

- (c) From Mrs. Jean Williams Steinlein - She suggests that the financial reports of the local sponsoring committee should be in the hands of the national committee no later than January 1st and a 50/50 split should be obtained instead of the present 60/40 split between the sponsoring committee and the national.

This letter will also be presented to the Board of Trustees.

- (d) From Mr. Price L. Jones - He felt we should be better organized to further promote local Gymanfa Ganu's, St. David Day programs and a newsletter should be sent regarding these events.

The President felt that the National Board of Trustees is properly organized for the benefit of the National Gymanfa Ganu activities and should confine it's work to Gymanfa affairs.

- (e) From Mr. O. Trygelles Williams of B.B.C. - He is interested in trying to get the B.B.C. to televize the National Gymanfa Ganus.

President felt we would be happy to hear from him again if this could ever be accomplished.

- (f) From Mr. Gwynn Parri - Mr. Parri designed an emblem for the Welsh National Gymanfa Ganu Association and suggested these could be made and sold if we would be interested.

The WAY report is to be given at the Board of Trustees meeting.

1. Mr. Emlyn Lloyd, President, called the meeting to order and Rev. Aeron Davies offered a prayer.
2. The President welcomed the members and expressed his deep regret of the absence of our Secretary, Mr. Jack Meadows from this session due to his recovery from a serious operation. Mr. Meadows is progressing very well and will soon be on the active list again.
3. A motion was made by Judge Jenkins, seconded by Gwynn Parri that a card be signed by everyone attending this meeting and sent to Mr. Jack Meadows. Motion carried.
4. Mr. D. M. Edwards gave the treasurer's report. Each member was given a copy of the report at this time. Mr. Edwards further stated that the books were audited by Mr. Richard Davies and Mr. Emrys Davies and this report would be given at the annual meeting on Saturday. This report was duly accepted by motion from Rev. Aeron Davies, seconded by Norman Williams. Motion carried.

The President thanked Judge Elwyn Jenkins for his assistance in procuring and filing the necessary legal forms and data that had to be filed in the State of Ohio due to the change in the name and revisions to our Constitution and By-laws.

Miss Eluned Thomas made mention of the fact that the report showed a decline in the membership dues. President explained that Mr. Jack Meadows has approximately \$700.00 that had not been sent in time for this report. Due to this decline Mrs. Ann Thomas and Rev. Aeron Davies felt a campaign should be had and perhaps the new board members could give this some thought. Mr. John Roberts stated that a Membership Application and Payment of Dues envelope had been enclosed in the letters that were sent out.

5. President said that Mr. D. M. Edwards had met with Mr. Jack Meadows and everything was turned over to him to take care of at this session.
6. Mr. D. M. Edwards reported that the secretary had a busy year, all necessary letters extending from the Salt Lake City business had been taken care of, together with hundred of other letters that were sent out. Also the new badges for the officers were taken care of, an ad placed in the Enfys, attended meeting of the executive committee with the Ontario Gymanfa Committee, met with the Chicago Committee, received reports from Wales for 1974, two thousand hymnals sold and one hundred phonetics, contacts with Cincinnati for 1974 National Gymanfa and Philadelphia for 1976. Upon motion this report was duly accepted.

7. The President explained the reason for the change from St. Catharines to Toronto for the 1973 convention. The executive committee upon arrangement made with the Ontario Gymanfa Ganu Association inspected the facilities available for the convention to be held at St. Catharines. Upon obtaining a complete picture of the whole situation involved the executive committee decided that St. Catharines could not meet the requirements needed to hold the 1973 session. The city of Toronto was available and accepted in lieu of St. Catharines. Mr. Lewis Edwards to give further details on this at our annual meeting on Saturday. A motion was made by Judge Elwyn Jenkins, seconded by John Jones that the Board of Trustees confirm the action taken by the Executive Committee on this matter. Motion carried.
8. President stated that the Gymanfa Ganu to be held in Swansea was progressing and a Mr. D. J. Evans, sent here at the expense of the Wales Tourist Board, is here to promote this. We will also be hearing from Dr. Thomas and Rev. Jones of New York in regard to the 1975 session. An invitation from Philadelphia by the Philadelphia Welsh Society and Women's Welsh Club will be received at our annual meeting. We still need an invitation for our 1974 National Gymanfa Ganu here in the states.
9. Mr. D. J. Evans of the Welsh Tourist Board and Mr. and Mrs. David W. Davis of Chicago, representing the WAY group were invited to the meeting at this time.

Mr. D. J. Evans of the Welsh Tourist Board and the Swansea Gymanfa Ganu Association presented three ties from Wales to Mr. Emlyn Lloyd for his distribution. "An Invitation" leaflet was distributed to each member with the program planned for August 1, 1974 thru August 10, 1974. Prices were also printed. He stated that he will be available to answer any questions about this trip at any time during the convention and that they had a table on the mezzanine floor for this purpose at the hotel. He hoped everyone would plan to attend and assured us that a good time would be had by everyone.

To clarify the position of the Welsh Tourist Board with regard to any transportation to Swansea from the United States and Canada, the President asked if there was any link between the two. Mr. Evans clearly stated that the only responsibility they have is to take care of the accommodations, main meals, local transport and social events after our arrival in Swansea. Transportation to Wales must be obtained by our local groups in this country. They would have absolutely nothing to do with any transportation from the states.

President thanked Mr. Evans for this fine report. Mr. Evans then left the meeting.

10. Mr. Gwynn Parri reported that the WAY group have again taken up activities and the main problem was the lack of communication they seem to have with the National Gymanfa Ganu Association. They are trying to iron this out. Mr. Parri assured them that any dictation from the board was not their intention, the Board of Trustees are more than willing to help them.

President asked Mr. Davis for any comments he would care to make or any questions. Mr. Davis said that he will be having a meeting of the WAY officers to discuss the resignation of their advisor, Mary Griswald. They would also look into the tour to Wales. Mr. Emlyn Lloyd assured them again that they were very much needed by the Welsh National Gymanfa Ganu Association. Mr. and Mrs. Davis then left the meeting.

11. The report of the Salt Lake City Gymanfa is to be given by Mrs. Ann Thomas on Saturday at the annual meeting. She has received a gift of \$200.00 which will be added to the report.

12. Mrs. Ann Davies Thomas reported on the hymnal committee and said that she had sent twenty letters out augmenting her committee by having regional representations. They will have a meeting sometime during the convention. She also reported that Mrs. Ada Thomas could not attend these meetings due to illness and Col. Thomas was to be appointed Senior Commander of the Spanish American War Veterans. He is now 92 years of age.

President felt that it may be sometime before we could have this new hymnal due to our financial status.

14. The President will be submitting to the annual meeting the "Rules and Regulations to Sponsoring Organizations of the Annual National and/or Regional Gymanfa Ganu." This updates the present instructions. A motion was made by Mr. Obie Coble, seconded by Judge Jenkins, that the board give to the President the authority to present this at his own discretion. Motion carried.

15. The following letters were received by the President:

- a. Ellen R. Jones, Brecksville, Ohio - She is a parliamentarian and offered her services to the Welsh National Gymanfa Ganu Association.
- b. W. Irving Davies, Toronto, Canada - He presented a resolution that the Welsh National Gymanfa Ganu Association should take over sponsoring the nationals.
- c. Jean Williams Steinlein, Chicago, Illinois - She suggested that the reports of the local sponsoring committee should be in the hands of the national committee no later than January 1st and a 50/50 split should be obtained in lieu of the present 60/40 split between the national and sponsoring committee.
- d. Mr. O.T. Williams of B.B.C. - This letter was sent to Mr. Jack Meadows stating that they would be interested in televising our National Gymanfas.
- e. Price L. Jones, Halsopple, Pa. - He stated that the National Gymanfa Ganu, St. David's Days, Local Gymanfa Ganus, etc., should be combined and promoted by the National Committee and a newsletter should be sent regarding these events.

- f. Gwynn Parri, Milwaukee, Wisconsin - Mr. Parri enclosed an emblem he designed in his letter for Welsh organizations to use. These could be made up and sold by the various Welsh groups.

These letters will be handled by the President as to the ones to be presented at the annual meeting. Motion by Mr. Gwynn Parri, seconded by Mrs. Ann Davies Thomas that no action need be taken on these letters by the Board of Trustees. Motion carried.

16. President asked Mr. Gwynn Parri to have a representation from the WAY group at our annual meeting on Saturday.
17. President said two plaques will be presented at the concert on Friday night. One to Mr. Ben Haddock and one to Jr. John C. Roberts, for all the services they have rendered since their association with the national committees.
18. There being no further business the meeting was adjourned at 6:30 P.M..

1. The meeting was called to order by the President and Mr. D. M. Edwards offered a prayer.

The President welcomed the newly elected and re-elected officers and wished for them a successful term.

2. Mr. Emlyn Lloyd expressed his appreciation to everyone who helped him during his term of office. This was a happy experience for him as well as an honor.
3. An election of officers was called.

President - Mr. Owen Roberts. Nominations were duly closed and the acting secretary was asked to cast a unanimous ballot. Mr. Roberts was duly declared President. He thanked the Board for their confidence in him and will continue to promote the very best interest for the Welsh National Cymanfa Ganu Association. He also invited Mr. Emlyn Lloyd, now Immediate Past President, to attend the meetings of the Board.

4. Vice President - Mr. Norman Williams

Nominations were duly closed and a secret ballot was taken with the result that Mr. Gwynn Parri was elected Vice President. Mr. Parri thanked the Board for this honor as acting as their Vice President.

Nominations were duly closed and the acting secretary casted a unanimous ballot. Mr. D. M. Edwards stated that Mr. Meadows would accept if elected.

Treasurer - Mr. D. M. Edwards

Nominations were duly closed and the recording secretary casted a unanimous ballot. Mr. D. M. Edwards thanked the Board for this privilege to serve them again.

Recording Secretary - Miss Catherine Dodd

Nominations were duly closed and the acting secretary was asked to cast a unanimous ballot. Miss Catherine Dodd accepted and thanked the Board for this opportunity to serve.

5. Mr. Emlyn Lloyd turned the meeting over to the new President and presented him with the gavel. Mr. Roberts congratulated Mr. Parri as the new Vice President and gave him his badge.
 6. Rev. Kenneth Jones expressed his personal feelings toward being elected to the board at this time and will serve in every way possible.
 7. Mr. D. M. Edwards stated that we should spread upon the minutes our unanimous expression of appreciation to Mr. Emlyn Lloyd for his excellent work during the past two years.
 8. A discussion concerning the new hymnals with Mr. D. M. Edwards giving the following figures. We now have 1800 hymnals on hand, enough to last a year. Since 1948, 1952, 1954, 1959, 1963 and 1968, 10,000 hymnals were ordered.
- Mr. Lewis Edwards stated that the time has come to make a final decision on these hymnals. A motion was made by Mr. Edwards that a decision be made today, by the board, regarding a new hymnal or reprinting of the old one. Seconded by Dr. D. L. Mandry. After a full discussion the motion was amended to add that we request Mrs. Ann Davies Thomas to have a report from her committee with a recommendation by January, 1973 and to hold off the reprinting of any further books. Seconded by Mair Monkhouse. Motion carried.
- Mrs. Ann Davies Thomas stated that she has a larger committee and she will reach a decision by January of 1973.
9. Mr. Emlyn Lloyd stated that we have a written invitation for the 1976 National to be held in Philadelphia by the Welsh Society and Women's Welsh Clubs and made a motion that we accept this invitation. Seconded by Dr. John Jones. Motion carried.
 10. Mr. Lewis Edwards asked about an invitation for 1974. Mr. Lloyd said that we have in the making an invitation to Cincinnati or Columbus, Ohio. Mr. Lewis further stated that in view of the Gymanfa Ganu in Wales in 1974 our time will have to be changed, from the Labor Day weekend.
 11. President, Owen Roberts asked the pleasure of the Board as to the continuation of publicity in Y Drych in the amount of \$200.00. Mr. Emlyn Lloyd so moved, seconded by Mr. Lewis Edwards, that this be continued. Motion carried.
 12. Miss Eluned Thomas made a motion that we should become a member of the "Undeb Y Gynry Ar Wasgar." Seconded by Mr. Ben Haddock. Motion lost.
 13. President asked Mr. Lewis Edwards if he had anything further to add concerning our National to be held in Toronto next year. Mr. Edwards stated that he did not have anything to add and he will be meeting with the President of the Toronto Sponsoring Committee. He further added that they would have a 60/40 split but warned that a 50/50 split will be brought up in the meeting again.
 14. Mr. Gwynn Parri had a meeting with the new President of the WAY group. They have taken a stronger hold during this session and have a more active part. They are asking the Board for \$200.00 to further finance their activities. Mr. Emlyn Lloyd said that he had spoken to the group in Salt Lake City and a collection was taken at that time which brought their balance in their treasury to \$400.00. Since then, expenses have come up and had to be paid. They now show a balance of \$150.00. No registration fee has been taken by them yet.

A discussion as to the wise spending of these monies was brought up by Mr. Lewis Edwards. Dr. John Jones explained that extra monies was needed to make up cards and other necessary mailing.

Miss Eluned Thomas suggested that they should have Liason officers from the Board. President appointed Mr. Gwynn Parri and Dr. John Jones as the Liason officers to WAY.

A motion was made by Dr. John Jones that we donate \$200.00 to the WAY organization. Seconded by Rev. Kenneth Jones. Motion carried.

Dr. John Jones made a motion that the WAY group be permitted to have a representation at our meetings. Seconded by Mr. Wynne Price. Motion carried.

Dr. John Jones made a motion that a financial report from the WAY group be in the hands of the Board of Trustees before their first meeting. Seconded by Mr. D. M. Edwards. Motion carried.

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned at 5:30 P.M..
