He helped establish Race Equality Councils across Wales, serving as Commissioner for the Commission for Racial Equality.

Led national investigations into racism, including Crown Prosecution Service, resulting in changes to practices and recruitment of ethnic minority people.

Wales' first ethnic minority judge, championing fairness across race, gender, disability, sexuality and class.
