Trash Trident

eace campaigners protested both at sea and on dry land when Trident submarine HMS Vanguard set sail for the first time.

The submarine's voyage was plagued by demonstrations at Barrow, where it was built, and on its arrival at the Clyde Submarine Base at Faslane, where it will undergo sea trials.

Vanguard's sea trials are due to take place around the Scottish Western Isles over the next few months.

They will consist of surface trials, sub-surface trials, safety checks, and deep-diving trials.

Following these tests the submarine will return to Barrow in early 1993 to allow any necessary modifications to be



made

Peace campaigners have pledged to continue protests for the duration of Vanguard's stay at Faslane.

Thousands protested against Trident at demonstrations throughout Scotland, Wales, and England before Vanguard set sail.

Campaigners from Wales travelled to Scotland to join CND's 'Trident, Alert' demonstration in Glasgow. In Wales candle-lit vigils took place at the Plaid Cymru annual conference at Rhyl and outside Cardiff's Atomic Weapons Establishment, where Trident nuclear warhead components are made.

Youth CND and Student CND will also be holding their Conferences at Cyncoed over the same period and young people will be particularly encouraged to participate in the main Conference business.

All CND members are welcome to attend Conference,

Keep it Shut



ver three hundred people marched through Caernarfon in October to show their concern over the start-up of the nuclear power station at nearby Trawsfynydd, Gwynedd.

The power station was shut down in February 1991 following the discovery that steel pressure vessels containing the plant's nuclear reactors were becoming embrittled at a faster rate than expected.

The brittle steel is prone to cracking, and should cracks develop a Chernobyl scale accident could happen at Trawsfynydd.

The plant's operators, Nuclear Electric, have claimed that the

steel will be less brittle at the high operating temperatures planned for the reactor.

However, during reactor startup the cold steel is still brittle, and the risk of fractures occuring in the pressure vessel is greatest.

The Caernarfon rally heard a statement from George Stroud, a local 12-year old schoolboy, urging Nuclear Electric to keep the Trawsfynydd reactors shut down.

George told those present that nuclear power has cast a dark cloud over North Wales and made a passionate appeal for the voice of his generation to be heard and heeded.

The rally was also attended by representatives of English campaign groups from Bradwell and Sizewell in East Anglia and from Dungeness in Kent, who are taking on the nuclear industry in their own communities.

Still Sacred

ver one hundred people attended a religious service in mid-October at the site of Capel Babell, a chapel which once served the now deserted communities in military ranges on Mynydd Eppynt, near Sennybridge.

The Eppynt ranges were formed in 1940 when 65,000 acres of farmland were seized by the military, displacing hundreds of people from their homes.

Despite promises that they would be allowed to return at the end of World War Two, the army has continued to occupy their land and is currently modernising and extending the ranges.

The service, organised by Cymdeithas y Cymod (the Fellowship of Reconciliation), questioned why this beautiful area is still denied to everyone — and in particular to the former inhabitants of the area and their descendants.



Let's Plan a Test Ban

n October 1991 President Gorbachov announced a year long halt to Soviet nuclear weapons testing and urged the world's other nuclear powers to also stop nuclear weapons tests.

This moratorium was later confirmed by President Yeltsin.

In April 1992 France surprised everyone by announcing a moratorium on its nuclear weapons tests for the rest of the year, with the possibility of an extension if the other nuclear powers also stopped testing.

This October a US moratorium on nuclear weapons tests came into effect, stopping all tests (including British ones, which are conducted on tribal lands belonging to the Western Shoshone people of Nevada) until July 1993.

After July 1993 the US wants to have five tests a year until 1996, after which they will stop testing for good.

In response to this American move, the countries of the former USSR have just announced an extension of their moratorium — until the American moratorium comes to an end.


The peace movement's

immediate aim must now be to get France to also extend its moratorium to match the US and former Soviet moratoria. If events continue at the pace that they have over recent weeks, this may have already happened by the time you read this!

Our more important longer term aim must be to persuade France, the USA, and the former Soviet countries to turn their individual moratoria on nuclear testing into a binding multilateral Comprehensive Test Ban Treaty (CTBT).

Britain has been completely marginalised in these developments because cannot test nuclear weapons American without operation, and the other confirmed nuclear power, China, will almost certainly observe a test ban treaty once the other countries have signed

A Comprehensive Test Ban Treaty has been the subject of negotiations for many years. Most of the details have already been agreed and — as usual — it's only the political will that's needed for the treaty to be finalised.
