## Newport Cricket Club 'The Averages' 1971 - Present

**In 1895 Arthur Silverlock Newport Cricket Club's Professional topped the Batting averages, scoring 869 runs from 16 Innings (4 n.o) and Averaged 72.5 (H.S. 158n.o)**

**He also took 36 wickets (Average 15.10) from 217.1 overs, 40 of which were maidens, conceding 550 runs (econ. 2.53)**

League Cricket was introduced at the start of the 1971 season and the Western League was created. Newport, Cardiff, St Fagans and the best clubs in S. West of England were invited

### Newport Cricket Club 1<sup>st</sup> X1 League Averages (1999 – Present)

With the introduction of the ECB County Cricket Boards the Western League was disbanded at the end of the 1998 season and Newport returned to play their League Cricket in Wales. Initially, the League was a poor standard East Wales League, before it was renamed as the South Wales (East) League. The South Wales Premier League was formed for the start of the 2010 season - League Cricket became much stronger then.
