COMMUNITY GREEN ENERGY

Following the lead from the Green Guerillas, a group met to talk about our own part in making our community one that can thrive and grow sustainably for the future generations. With time running out for us to make changes, responsibility belongs to us all. But how do I reduce my own carbon footprint even by a little? How can I reduce my energy bills? What could we in St Hilary do together to make the air we breathe cleaner and safer for our children? Graham Nash once sang -"Teach your children well" but how? How do we demystify this? Could we work together? This was just a first 'conversation' but the knowledge, expertise and teamwork of many of our St Hilary residents shone through. Topics discussed ranged from harnessing effective sources of energy and insulation, to improved permaculture, a community transport scheme and more.

We have many pioneers in this village, ready to pass on their experiences and to develop community resilience, we will form groups who are willing to support those who may want to understand more about renewables or are considering individual changes to their properties. We need your input because we want to explore inclusive projects that do things with people, rather than to them, so we want to hear from more of you with queries or anything that would be important to you.



We are willing to come together for a first small project that can benefit all who are part of St Hilary and feel the village hall may be the thing that offers some scope for this. Perhaps from this we could springboard to other larger projects, even possibly joining forces with nearby villages to achieve wider gains. We are currently trying to set up dates with Community Energy Wales and others to come to speak to us, to open up our thinking and help us track down funding opportunities. A new section will appear in the newsletter - Green Tips of the Month - tiny things we could all do to make a difference. Green Tips will be a shared village column. So please - help us all learn more by posting your own best tips to Liz Loch and do include your children too!!

A message from Patrick Whelan about Climate Change: "We could do nothing. Or can we, in St Hilary, take small but realistic steps to help recovery. We could improve biodiversity and capture carbon in dozens of gardens. Think about it! Let's meet in the New Year to explore possibilities."
