The St Hilary Forum held its annual meeting in the village hall on Tuesday January 16th. Around 25 people attended and were treated to a wonderful buffet and a glass of wine (or two). At the meeting, villagers had the opportunity to:

- Catch up with the news and gossip from the village; •
- Vote for the Village Logo competition;
- Be updated about what the Forum had been up to in 2017 and plans for 2018 (including the Village Bake Off); and,
- Be enthralled by Bill Strong talking about his military career. ٠ A big thank you to all those who helped and to those who attended.

BILL STRONG IN "TROUBLE SPOTS OF THE WORLD"

Those attending the annual meeting of St Hilary Forum were treated to a wonderful talk by Bill Strong about his illustrious military career.



After eschewing a lucrative career in finance and resisting the allure of a life as a jazz drummer, Bill embarked on a journey that took him and Angela to Aden (part of modern Yemen), Oman, Saudi Arabia, Northern Ireland and Borneo. Eventually he was responsible for the mobilisation of 46,000 troops, being 3rd in command of the

Headquarters during the 1st Gulf War. Memorable anecdotes included:

- Writing to Defence Minister Dennis Healy who approved his posting to Aden, where Bill and his colleagues were attacked with mustard gas;
- Experiencing the overthrow of Said bin Taimur by his son • Sultan Qaboos in a palace coup in Oman in 1970;
- Being posted to Borneo, only to arrive after the war had ended!
- Enjoying drinks from the proceeds of 14 stitches, at £44 a stitch, that one of his colleagues had in a wound – when only 3 stiches were really needed;
- Successfully opening a champagne bottle with a sabre, to the chagrin of the French military attaché who had issued the challenge; and,
- General Sir Peter de la Billière, former Commander-in-Chief • of the British forces in the Gulf War, getting lost in St Hilary and ending up in the Bush!

IN OTHER NEWS **BAG 2 SCHOOL** LLANFAIR PRIMARY SCHOOL



Llanfair Primary PTA has regular collections of unwanted clothing and textiles, for which they receive 40p per kilo. This is a good way of recycling unwanted items and

raising money for the school in the process! Information about what can be donated to Bag2School is show below. Items should be of good quality, as they are for re-use.

We accept the following 'good quality' items for RE-USE:

- Men's, Ladies' and Children's clothing
- · Paired shoes (tied together or elastic band around)
- Handbags
- Hats
- Bags
- Scarves and ties
- lewellerv
- Lingerie
- Socks
- Belts
- Soft toys
- Household linen
- (f) Curtains Towels
- Bedding (bed sheets, pillow cases and duvet covers)

We DO NOT accept:

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- Duvets and blankets
- Pillows and cushions
- Carpets, rugs and mats (including bath, shower and toilet mats)
- · Soiled, painted, ripped or wet clothing
- School uniforms with and without logo
- Corporate clothing and workwear
- Textile off cuts, yarns or threaded material

Items can be placed in any plastic bag or bin liner which must be brought to school on the morning of the collection and left by 9am at the top of the car park, near the gate into the school playground. The next collection will be on Friday March 9th.

NOTE: Bags can be brought to St Hilary village hall on Wednesday March 7th between 10.30am and noon, during the drop in coffee morning.

LLANFAIR PRIMARY SCHOOL PTA

Llanfair Primary School PTA is currently fundraising to improve the playground space: specifically we hope to purchase ball-stop netting to prevent balls from going into the gardens of houses which adjoin the playground. This will allow children to be able to play more freely without the worry of causing nuisance to the school's neighbours. We then hope to create zones within the playground to allow for different activities to take place. Also, we are fundraising to purchase lockers for the Junior building and to pay for minor works to the current cloakroom area to improve the current space. Since September we have raised £204 from Bag2School collections, £195 from our Halloween Disco, £210 from the Waitrose Community Matters scheme, £427 from our Christmas Hamper Raffle and £1625 from our Christmas Fayre. We are still waiting to hear how much we raised from Christmas tree sales at Ty Cerrig (we get a percentage if Llanfair PTA is mentioned when purchasing a tree) and from sales of MyArtProject Christmas cards and gift items designed by our children.
