THE RED TELEPHONE KIOSK IN ST HILARY IS NEARLY OURS!



The adoption of the K2 listed Red Telephone Kiosk from BT, as proposed by members of the St Hilary Forum in 2016 is progressing well. Llanfair Community Council held a public meeting in August, following which they

agreed to be the official adoption body. The BT consultation continues, and the approval from the Vale of Glamorgan Conservation Officer to restore the listed structure for use as a community resource has been given.



The current plans are to restore the kiosk, so that it no longer looks neglected, and to gather suggestions

for how it might be used e.g. as a book / magazine swap spot; information stop, history of the village etc.
