The Court Baron of the Rt. Hon. Herbert Lord Viscount Windsor of the said Manor 27th September 1749 before Tho. the Gent. Deputy Steward and in presence of Howell Lewis, Reeve, William Jones, Bailiff, Rd. Bassett ~~Comp. Gorse~~ Morgan John Tho. Rees Jo Thomas and others customary tenants of sd Manor

To this Court came Jo Thomas one of the customary tenants of the sd Manor and Surviving Heff to Sampson Sweeting Gent deceased by and with the assent and consent of David Sweeting Gent customary heir to the said Sampson Sweeting and surrendered into the hands of the Lord of the sd Manor by the hands of his sd deputy Steward by the Rod according to the custom of the sd Manor all that customary hold piece or parcel of land containing by estimation one acre now an orchard lying and being at Abestun within the sd Manor contiguous to the South part of the new orchard there and having ① the limits of Ellulium (sic) Sweeting widow on the North East part ② the land of the Rt. Hon. Com. Lord Talbot of the South part ③ the Highway leading from Abestun to Hantrisant of the West part thereof with its appurtenances and to use &c of David Sweeting and his customary heirs for ever according to the custom of the said Manor and at the same Court to the sd David Sweeting and took of sd. Lord of the sd Manor by the Rod according to the custom of the said Manor the sd premises with the appurtenances to have and to hold &c
