## 73 High Street

This property in the eighteenth century seems to have been part of The Tanyard, originally owned by Thomas Wyndham, and which is dealt with under the heading 'Coopers Lane'. However, there probably was a house fronting the main street.

## Sarah Ward.

She married (1) William Breeze. Had two children including George Breeze, initially underkeeper with his stepfather at Penllyn, then head keeper there. He moved to St Fagans

(2) Frederick Ward. Had 3 children – Bertha (married Fred Inns in Cowbridge in 1897), Maggie, and Frederick William, who was looked after by George Breeze (grandfather of informer). Frederick Ward was head gamekeeper at Penllyn Castle and lived in the Keeper's Lodge until his death in 1889 – when widow Sarah and family moved to Cowbridge. ## 73 and 75 High Street and Cooper's Lane

When a bulldozer happened to collide with the almost derelict corn stores at 75 High Street in 1975, it showed that a substantial medieval building lay behind the 18th facade (and that in turn had been built over Roman property). The area around Cooper's Lane has had some interesting changes of use.

In the early 18th century, it possibly housed the bakehouse and tanyard of Thomas Wyndham; by the middle of the 18th century the area had been purchased by Thomas Edmondes and housed two malthouses (Edmondes frequently stipulated in leases of inns that malt should be purchased from these malthouses). The arched roof of the cellars associated with a brewhouse at the rear could be seen until recently.

Thus it is not surprising that the courtyard was known as Malthouse Lane, and in the 19th century contained four or five cottages largely occupied by labourers or journeymen, and it is only for No 73 that one can with any degree of certainty work out the names of the inhabitants (Mary Lutton in 1851, James Eddolls in 1861, Elizabeth Morris in 1871, Hannah Britton in 1881 and Sarah ward n 1891). By 1912, however, one celebrated resident in the Lane was Jim The Cooper, James Lewis, who made barrels and lived on the premises. After his death, Eddie John used the front, substantial part of the premises as Corn Stores.

Today, No 73 is a private residence, 75 houses the Yorkshire Building Society and Anthony Jarvie solicitors, while the new houses in the now Cooper's Lane are among the few new buildings in Cowbridge to have been well/received in the new 'Pevsner' of Glamorgan.
