

The Will of Cecill Williams, spinster of Cowbridge. 8th August 1752

Bequests.

To my Nephew David Williams of Llanquian, gent, all that messuage, curilage, garden and appurtenances situate and being in the Eastern village of the town of Cowbridge, and his heirs and assigns forever in consideration of him paying the several legacies bequeathed within one year of my decease.

I give to my wellbeloved nephew Mr David Williams the use of the furniture of my house during his life and afterwards to Dorothy Williams, daughter of Mr Jenkin Williams of Cowbridge.

In case of her death to Thomas Williams, son of Jenkin Williams, his heirs and assigne forever.

To Dorothy Williams the sum of ten pounds when she comes to the age of 21 years and if she should be dead then to Thomas Williams son of Jenkin Williams.

To my niece Alice Williams, daughter of Mr Morgan Williams the sum of five pounds.

To my niece Mary Williams, daughter of Mr Morgan Williams, the sum of five pounds

To my cousin, Mary Morgans widow, living at Cardiff, a guinea to buy a mourning ring.

To her daughter Mary Williams, a guinea to buy a mourning ring.

To Thomas Morgans a guinea to buy a mourning ring

To Mary Tanner of Cowbridge, a guinea.

To Elizabeth Rutledge of Cowbridge the sum of three pounds and three shillings.

to Thomas Skynner, my godson, one pound.

To the poor of the parishes of Cowbridge and Llanblithyan, twenty shillings to be given in bread or money.

I donominate and appoint Mr David Williams my nephew to be my sole executor of this my last will and testament revoking and disannulling all other wills and testaments by me heretofore made. In witness hereunto i set my hand and seal
