I, John of good memory, do hereby give and bequeath to my servant John Morgan, all that my Barne with the appertaining lands and
 tenements without the west gate of the town of Cambridge aforesaid, for and during the term of his natural life
 if he do remain a continer so long unmarried, and not otherwise, and after the decease of the said John Morgan or
 of his wife the said John Morgan shall happen to marry, that then my will is and I do hereby give and bequeath the
 freehold and reversion of the said Barne unto the above named Widow the daughter of the said William Cymon of
 Colchester and to her heirs forever. To have and to hold the said Barne with the appertaining lands and tenements, and the
 profits of the said Barne, unto the said Widow her heirs and assigns forever, according to the true intent and meaning of this my last will and testament.
 I, John of good memory, do hereby give and bequeath to the said John Morgan, one pair of gold shoes, one pair of gold gloves, one brace
 of pistols of the best of steel, and one little brass poppet, one brass watch, two peroteo platters, one board with frame
 and lists in the wall, and two other things not herein named, which I do hereby give and bequeath to the said John Morgan
 of Cambridge, I, John of good memory, do hereby give and bequeath to Richard Morgan, my servant, all the goods and chattels of
 my household which one month next after the probate of this my last will, finally all the rest and residue of my goods
 and chattels and realties, not formerly herein expressed, I do hereby give and bequeath unto
 my wellbelovéd Brother, Thomas Davids of Colchester aforesaid, whom I do nominate, ordaine and appoint to
 be my whole and sole executor of this my last will and testament, and in further declaration of my aforesaid last
 will and testament I do hereby give and bequeath unto the said Thomas Davids, in witness whereof I have hereunto put my
 marks and sett my seal unto this my last will and testament, the day and year first above written.
