Will of Thomas William, 15th April, 1653

In the Name of God Amen, This ffifteenth day of Aprill in the yeare of our Lord God one Thousand six hundred ffifty & three I Thomas William of Cowbridge in the County of Glamorgan yeoman being (thankes be to God) in p[er]fecte memory, but weake in Body doe make my last Will and Testament in maner & foeme following;

ffirst I bequeave my soule to almighty God my maker & Redeemer & my body to the grave,

Item I give unto my daughter Elizabeth William ten pounds;

Item I give unto her my greate Brasse pan

Item I give unto her Seven sheepe being p[ar]te of xxi^{tie} sheep in the hands of William Scacye Alderman & the other ten I give five of them to my step daughter Mary Sant? & five to Barbara Sant? My step daughter;

Item I give unto my maide servant Maude Cole? five shillings

Item I give unto the poore of the Towne of Cowbridge five shillings to be disposed unto them by my wife.

And I do hereby make and appoint my deare wife margarett Portman al[ia]s William to be executrix of this my last Will & Testament, & if my foesaid daughter Elizabeth William happen to dye before shee attaine to the edge of sixteen yeares my will & desire is, that my wife receive and keepe the said ten pounds sheepe & brasse pan to her owne p[ar]ticular use & behoofe And I make my Brother Piers? deare to be overseer of this my last will & testamente, witness my hande and Seale the day & yeare abovesaid
