

The will of David Lloyd of Cowbridge, Master of Arts, Vicar of Llantrisant and Llancarfan, dated 11th., February 1668.

To be buried in Cowbridge Church.

To Llandaff Cathedral 5s.

To Cowbridge Church 5s.

To the poor of Cowbridge 20s.

To his brother Richard Lloyd £20.

To his brother Phillip Lloyd £30.

To his nephew Thomas Lloyd, the eldest son of John Lloyd all books.

To his nephew John Lloyd, second son of John Lloyd £5.

To his nephew David Lloyd, youngest son of John Lloyd, £5.

To Mrs. Rachel Thomas, his patroness at Llantrisant, £5.

To his sister Elizabeth Lloyd, the house with appurtenances where his brother John lived. If she died then the property was to pass to his brother Phillip or in default to his brother Richard.

All his goods including moneys from his livings and the school to his sister Elizabeth as executrix.

vicar of Lantiffont and Lencarvan in the county  
of Glamorgan and Bricist of Landuff, Calling to  
minds the infirmitie of this mortall life, and advisedly  
considering after the best manner I can to bestow  
sett in order and Dispose my self towards almighty  
god my maker, and my Lands goods cattle and chattle  
towards ye world whereby his bountifull goodness I re-  
ceived the same; ~~and~~ by these presents make pronounce  
and Declare my last will and testament in manner  
and forme following, that is to say first I comend  
my soule into the hands of Almighty god Resosching  
him of his infinite mercy and for the merits and pay  
of his dear sonne christ Iesus to receive the same  
into the everlasting fellowship of his blessed spirit  
whenever it shall please him to take it out of this  
frail body of mine, with body I comend to be bur-  
ied in parish church of Cambridge aforesaid. I Item  
give to the Cathedral church of Landuff five shillings  
I Item give and bequeath to the church of Cambridge  
aforesaid 20 shillings I Item I give and bequeath to the poor  
of ye sd towne of Cambridge 20 shillings I Item I give and be-  
queath to my brother Richard Heyd twenty pounds  
I Item I give and bequeath to my brother Phillip Heyd  
thirty pounds. I Item I give and bequeath to my nephew

Thomas Lloyd Esq. give to my brother John Lloyd all my books  
I have & give and bequeath to my nephew John Lloyd second  
son to my sd brother John Lloyd. v. l. I do give and be-  
queath to my nephew David Lloyd youngest son to my  
sd brother John Lloyd. v. l. I do give to Mrs Rachel  
Thomas my patroness for Leatifford. v. l. I do give  
and bequeath to my only sister Elizabeth Lloyd  
my house with the appertinances where my sd  
brother John now liveth and inhabiteth, but if my  
sd sister Elizabeth shall happen to dye without is-  
sue, then the sd house with its appertinances I give  
and bequeath to my sd brother ~~Richard~~ and  
in defect of him to my sd brother Richard, and  
to my sd sister Elizabeth I give and bequeath all my  
goods chattels either moveable or immoveable,  
and also all my debts profits & emoluments and  
arrearages, due, or payable, to me by bill, bond or  
any other way whatsoever, from any of my liv-  
ings, schools, or from any other my profession  
or enjoyments whatsoever, with sd sister Elizabeth  
I do by these presents nominate make and  
appoint, and declare to be, my sole executor  
of this my last will and testament, to whom  
I have set my hand and the time first above written
