The will of Lewis Evors of Cowbridge, Alderman, made 28th., May 1706.

To be buried in Cowbridge Church.

To the poor of Cowbridge, 10s.

After the death of his wife Maud, the house in Cowbridge was to pass to James Mayo of Bonvilston, Tailor.

To his wife Maud Kemeys and her heirs, 4 acres of customaryhold land in Llanblethian called Cae'r Lake adjoining a parcel of land called Heol Lake or Lake Way. The feoffees of the 4 acres - Richard Sweeting and Richard Bassett were to resurrender the property at the request of his wife according to the custom of the manor.

To Mary Richard his maid servant, £5 to be paid within 2 years of his death, and the feather bed and appurtenances in the kitchen where she sleeps, a little brass pot, a little brass milk pan, a pewter platter, a pewter plate, a pewter porringer, a wooden chair, a joint stool, a ewe and a lamb.

To Richard Sweeting a riding saddle

To William Evors, half a crown.

All the rest of his goods to his wife Maud Kemeys as executrix.
