

The will of Maude Kemeys also Evor, of Cowbridge, widow, dated 9th., March 1713.

Bread to the value of 12s. to be distributed on the day of the funeral.

To her niece Ann Kemeys, the daughter of her brother John Kemeys, married to David Price, 2s. 6d. to be paid within a month of Maude's death.

Her power held under a copy of the court roll over 4 acres in the manor of Llanblethian dated 8th., April 1708, to her nephew John Williams, Alderman of Cowbridge. The 4 acres were commonly called Pedair erw y Lake?

The rest of her goods to John Williams as executor.

In the Name of God Amen I Mando Honyes att. Ever of the Town of Cowbridge in the  
County of Glamorgan widow, being of perfect Mind & Memory, Thanks be given unto God  
for his mercies and ordains this my Last Will & Testament, in Manner & Form following, That is  
to say, First and Chiefly I give my soule into the hands of Almighty God, who gave it me  
and my Body I Comend to the Earth, to be decently Buried in Christian Buriall, at  
the Discretion of my Executors, Nothing doubting, but at the generall Resurrection  
I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God, as containing, the  
worthy Estate, wherewith I have pleased God to Bless me, I give Devise  
Bequeath and Dispose of the same in Manner & Form following, I Bequeath  
to be Distributed in Toward to the value of twelve Shillings att my Generall Day  
by my Executors hereafter named, I give and Bequeath unto my Heire Anne  
Honyes, the daughter of my Brother John Honyes, now married to David Lute  
the sum of two Shillings & six pence, to be payd her within a Month next  
after my Decease, by my Executors hereafter named, And whereas, It is in my  
power by virtue of a Copie Court Roll (so Dispos. of a Bequeath. four acres  
of Customary Lands in w<sup>th</sup> in the Regime of Lambetham) bearing date the eight  
day of April, in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred & eight I therefore  
by virtue of that power aforesaid do give Devise & Bequeath, unto my Loving &





the sum of two shillings & six pence, as to be given  
 after my decease, by my Executor hereafter named, And whereas, It is in my  
 power by virtue of a Copy Court Roll to Discharge of a Boquath four acres  
 of Customary Lands in w<sup>th</sup> in the manor of Lambethen bearing date the eighth  
 day of April, in the year of our Lord our Thousand seven Hundred & Eighty I therefore  
 by virtue of that power aforesaid Do give Do give & Boquath, unto my Loving &  
 Nephew John Williams Thorman of the Town of Cambridge aforesaid. the said four  
 acres aforesaid w<sup>th</sup> the appurtenances called Lower Eving Lake, situated within the Lordship of  
 Lambethen aforesaid, To Have and to hold the sd four acres, from & after my decease  
 as aforesaid unto the sd John Williams & his heirs forever, Lastly I do hereby Revoke  
 my sd Nephew John Williams; to be my Executor of this my Last will & Testament  
 and do Boquath unto my sd Executor all the rest & residue of my goods & Chattels  
 whatsoever herein before not Boquathed, and do hereby Revoke, Disannull & make void  
 all former wills by me heretofore made; and this only I allow to be my Last will & Testament  
 as witness my hand & Seal the Twelfth Day of March in the year of our Lord, our  
 Thousand seven Hundred & Thirteen
