I give devise and bequeath unto my Loving wife all my Good
 and Chattell and personal Estate unto my Loving wife Elizabeth
 who I appoint whole and sole Executrix of my last will
 and Testament and last my son David John who I turne out
 of the house where now I live in give my set wife Elizabeth
 the house for the Month after my Decease. In witness whereof
 I have hereunto sett my hand and Seal this 25th day of
 October 1723.
