

The will of Wenllian John, widow, of Cowbridge, dated 4th., June 1746.

To John Hopkin, a guinea.

To her niece, Margaret Hopkin, a guinea.

To Edward Bates, a guinea.

The rest of her goods to her sons John and William David and her daughter Mary David as joint executors.

The mark of Wenllian John.

Witnessed by John Williams, Margaret Cottee, John Jones.

Proved - 30th., June 1746.

In the Name of God Amen upon the fourth
Day of June 1746 I ^{William Jones} of the ^{Parish of} ~~Parish of~~ ^{County of} Glamorgan
in the County of Glamorgan widow being sick and weak in Body
but of sound and perfect mind and memory thank be to Almighty
God for it I do make constitute and ordain this my Last Will and
Testament in manner and form following

Imprimis I do bequeath my soul into the hands of the Almighty God
Who first gave it and my body to the grace to be buried in a decent
manner. Item I give and bequeath to my wife John Hopkin one pound
and Shilling. Item I give and bequeath to my niece Margaret Hopkin one pound and
one Shilling. Item I give and bequeath to Edward Bates one pound and Shilling.
Item I give and bequeath to my son John David and my son
William David ~~and~~ my Daughter Mary David all my goods
chattels and chattels as Bills Bonds money or monies worth and I
do nominate and appoint John William and Mary Joseph and
John Executors of this my Last Will and Testament they paying
and discharging all the Legacies a beere mentioned hereinafter
whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal the Day
and year a beere written ~~for~~ the ~~mark~~ of
