 chattels & all his debts & owing his household

 Sister Jansons and his neece Corill Edwards
 he did also give and bequeath his dwelling
 house and all his household stuffe unto his two
 sisters Catharine and Jansons during their
 both naturall lives and after their deaths
 he did give and bequeath unto his sd. neece
 Corill Edwards his sd. dwelling house together
 with all of his household stuffe unto her & her heirs
 for ever; and ^{whom he appointed his sole executor} ⁱⁿ ^{the} ^{administration} ^{to} ^{be} ^{taken} ⁱⁿ
