County of Glamorgan, Esq. Deceased made  
and declared his last will and Testament  
uninterrupted about the month of January  
or there aboute in manner and forme  
following in the year of our Lord God 1663 viz  
he did give and bequeath all his singular his goods  
chattels & other debts excepting his Household  
Stuffe to his Equally divided betweene his  
sonnes Damfond and his neare Corill Edwards  
he did also give and bequeath his Dwelling  
House and all his Household Stuffe unto his two  
sisters Catharine and Damfond during their  
both naturall lives and after their decess  
he did give and bequeath unto his sonne  
Corill Edwards his ffe dwelling house together  
with all of his household Stuffe unto her of her heires  
for 86 dars: and if by any misfortune to be taken in
