4. Will of Elizabeth Kemeys

In the name of God amen, 23 January 1682/3, I Elizabeth Kemeys of Lanblethian being sick in body make this my last will and testament, revoking all former wills and testaments, legacies and bequests heretofore by me made. I commend my soul to the hands of my blessed saviour and redeemer, Jesus Christ and my body to the earth to be decently buried after a christian manner.

I give my loving brother, Thomas Kemeys, my share being the third yet undivided of that mansion house wherein we now cohabit and all the outhouses, buildings, gardens, orchards and appurtenances as were given to me and my sisters, Katherine the wife of Richard Bassett of Lanblethian and Cecill Kemeys the younger, jointly, share and share alike and our respective heirs, by the last will and testament in writing of our father, Thomas Kemeys, gent., deceased.

I give my sister, Cecil Kemeys the younger, 2 acres of meadow in Lanblethian called Gwayn y Gwbbber Well as I purchased of my brother George Kemeys, with all deeds concerning the same.

I give my brother Richard Kemeys, one feather bed and bolster.

I give my sister Katherine, the wife of Richard Bassett, £30.

I give my nephew Edward Kemeys, son of my late brother, John Kemeys, deceased, £5.

I give my sister Frideswith, the wife of David Thomas, clerk, £10.

I give my nephews and nieces Rowland, Thomas, David, Richard, Elizabeth and Phillipia, sons and daughters of the said David and Frideswith, 20s apiece, to be paid within one year after my decease by my sister Cecill whom I appoint to be executrix of this my last will and testament.
