And if same goods, Chells & Credits come to y^e hands & possession of y^e sd^d John Deere or any other person or persons for him doe well and truly adstratour according to law and further doe make or cause to be made a true and just account of his sd^d Adcon. att or before y^e twenty first day of December 1701 And all y^e rest and residue of y^e sd^d Goods, Chells and Credits w^{ch} shall be found remaining upon y^e sd^d Adstratour's account of same being first examined and allowed by y^e Judge or Judges for y^e time being of y^e sd^d C[ou]rt shall deliv^r and pay unto such person or persons respectively as y^e sd^d Judge or Judges by his or their Decree or sentence according to y^e true intent & meaning of a late Act of Parliam^t in that behalf made and provided shall limit & appoint.
