

The will of Abednego William, yeoman, of Llanblethian dated 6<sup>th</sup> August 1705.

To his daughter Gwennlian William the sum of £5 to be paid a year after his death.

To his niece Margaret Morgan a shilling in a similar manner.

To his nephew Evan Jenkins a shilling.

To his niece Margaret Jenkins a shilling

To his nephew Thomas Jenkins a shilling

To his niece Elizabeth Jenkins a shilling.

The rest of his goods to his nephew John Jenkins, who was living with him, as executor.

Witnessed by John Richard, Michael William, Joan Lewis, Robert Williams.

Proved 2<sup>nd</sup> April 1706.
