

The will of William Wrexem, yeoman, of Llanblethian made 7th., September 1750.

To his niece Margaret Richard £10 to be paid to her on reaching 21. In the meantime she was to receive the interest from it. Should she not survive then the money was to be divided between his brother John Wrexem and his sisters Mary Thomas, Jane Llewellyn and Anne Robert.

All his goods and chattels to be sold and the money divided between his brother John and his sisters Mary and Jane.

His leasehold lands held from William, Lord Talbot to his father Lewis Wrexem and thence to his sister Ann Robert.

He appoints his brother John Wrexem to be guardian of his aged father and niece Margaret Richard.

To his father the bed and bed clothes used by the maid.

To his niece Catharine Wrexem a guinea.

His household goods and land to be held on to and managed until the following May.

The grates in the house to be left to continue where they are.

His brother John Wrexem to be executor.

I William Wrexen of the Parish of Lanchethan in the  
 County of Glamorgan Yeoman do make my Last Will & Testament  
 in Manner following And as to the Estate God has blessed me with  
 I give & bequeath unto my Niece Margaret Richard the same  
 of Ten pounds to be payd her by my Executor herein after named  
 when she shall arrive unto the Age of twenty and one Years, and  
 in the Mean time the said Margaret to have the annual Interest of  
 the Ten Pounds. But if she happen to die before she arrives at the said  
 Age of one and twenty then the said summe of Ten Pounds to be equally  
 divided betwix my Brother John Wrexen my Sister Mary Thomas  
 and my Sister Anne Robert ~~and my Sister Jane~~  
 my Sister Jane ~~Wrexen~~. All my Household Goods Cattles and Chattel  
 + what soever after the Payment of my just Debts I give and  
 bequeath to be sold and made the most of and equally divided betwix  
 my said Brother John my said Sister Mary and my said Sister  
 Jane. My Lease hold Estate which I hold from William Lord  
 Talbot I give unto my Father Lewis Wrexen during his life and  
 after his Decease to my Sister Anne Robert. I do further  
 appoint my Brother John Wrexen to be Guardian ~~over~~  
 over my aged Father and over my Niece Margaret Richard  
 to see that they have justice done therein. To my Father I also  
 give One Red & Red Cloath on which the Monies do now lie  
 To my Niece Catharine Wrexen I give one Guinea. I do appoint  
 also that my Household Goods & Lands be held on and managed  
 in the same Manner as at present till May next. Lastly I appoint  
 my Brother John Wrexen to be Executor of this my Last Will  
 made this seventh Day of September in the Year of our Lord  
 Christ one thousand seven hundred and fifty  
 I further Order that the Graves in my House be left to continue where they are  
 standing Witness my Hand and Seal

well and faithfully to execute the same, to exhibite an Inventory &c  
to render a just Account of his Administration thereof, which  
thereunto lawfully required.
