The will of William Wrexem, yeoman, of Llanblethian made 7th., September 1750.

To his niece Margaret Richard £10 to be paid to her on reaching 21. In the meantime she was to receive the interest from it. Should she not survive then the money was to be be divided between his brother John Wrexem and his sisters Mary Thomas, Jane Llewellyn and Anne Robert.

All his goods and chattels to be sold and the money divided between his brother John and his sisters Mary and Jane.

His leasehold lands held from William, Lord Talbot to his father Lewis Wrexem and thence to his sister Ann Robert.

He appoints his brother John Wrexem to be guardian of his aged father and niece Margaret Richard.

To his father the bed and bed clothes used by the maid.

To his niece Catharine Wrexem a guinea.

His household goods and land to be held on to and managed until the following May.

The grates in the house to be left to continue where they are. His brother John Wrexem to be executor.
