 Bishop of Landaff, in the sum of two hundred & pounds of good Lawfull Money of Great
 Britain, to be paid unto the said Bishop or his lawfull attorney his Ex^{ty} adm^{ty} or assigns on
 request for & good faithfull paym^t of us: Item we do truly & lawfully, we bind ourselves and
 each of us jointly and severally for whole, our heirs, Ex^{ty} adm^{ty} firmly by these presents
 sealed with our Seals and dated the Second Day of April, in the Year of our
 Lord Christ 1769.

The Condition of this Obligation is such, that if the above Countess Joan^{na} Richard the
 Widow and Administratrix of all and singular the Goods, Chattels and
 Credits of Richard David late of the parish of Lambethian of our said
 the County of Glamorgan and Executor of Landaff Batchelor deceased

do make a lease to be made, a true & perfect Inventory of all singular Goods, Chattels Credits of J^o Deceased, which
 have or shall come to the hands, possession or knowledge of the said Joan^{na} Richard
 or into the hands or possession of any other person or persons for her and the same is made, do
 exhibit or cause to be exhibited into the Registry of the Consistory Court of Landaff, at or before the
 Second Day of July or next ensuing, and the same Goods, Chattels Credits
 and all other Goods, Chattels and Credits of the said Deceased, at the time of his Death, or which
 at any time after shall come to, hand or possession of the said Joan^{na} Richard
 or into the hand or possession of any other person or persons for her do well and truly
 administer according to Law; and further do make cause to be made, a true and just account
 of her said administration, at or before the Second Day of April which
 will be in Year 1754. and all the rest and residue of J^o Goods, Chattels and Credits which
 shall be found remaining upon the said Administratrix account thereunto, being
 first examined and allowed of by the Judge of the said Court for the time being shall be
 and pay unto such person or persons respectively as the said Judge by his Decree or
 sentence pursuant to the true intent and meaning of an Act of Parliament, intituled an
 Act for the better settling of Intestates Estates shall think and appoint, and if hereafter it
 shall appear any last will and Testament was made by the said Deceased, and thereunto
 therein named do exhibit the same into the said Court, making request to have it
 approved of accordingly if the said Joan^{na} Richard or her being thereunto lawfully
 required, do render and deliver the said letters of administration of the said Deceased
 Testament being first made, into the said Court. Then this Obligation to be void and
 of no Effect it also to remain in full force and virtue.
