

The will of William Morgan of Newton, Llanblethian yeoman, dated 26th., March 1755.

To his daughter Mary Abraham 1s.

To his granddaughter Jane Abraham, daughter of Mary Abraham, 5s.

To his daughter Margaret Morgan, who was living with him all the rest of the goods as executrix.

Proved 30th., September 1755, the assets amounting to less than £20.

of Ponton in the parish of Llantwit Major and County of Glamorgan  
yeoman being weak in body but in perfect memory that it is  
I give to my Daughter Mary Bracken over hillings and I also  
leave to my Granddaughter Anna Abraham daughter of yours  
Henry Abraham Lewis hillings, item, I Give and bequeath  
to my Daughter Margaret Morgan now living the sum of  
my Personall Estate what hinder to see and apoint her  
Husband John Excertre and his wife signature of this my  
Last will and Testament, in witness whereof I put my  
hand and seal the Day and Date hereof the 26<sup>th</sup> Day  
of March 1755.

Daughter, the sole Executrix in this will named, who was first on  
the Holy Evangelists personally sworn well and faithfully to execute the  
same, to exhibit an Inventory & to render a just Account of  
her administration thereof when thereunto lawfully required.
