All his goods to Elizabeth, his wife, as executrix.

In the Name of God Amen, I Evan William
of Aburthin in the parish of Lanblethin and County of
Glamorgan Yeoman being Weak in Body but of sound
mind memory and understanding thanks be to God —
therefore Do make and Ordain my last Will and Testament
in manner and form following (that is to say) I Give and
Bequeath unto Elizabeth my beloved wife all and Singular
my Goods and Chattles of every kind whatsoever that I shall
Die possessed of or be Interested in at the time of my —
Decease And I hereby nominate and appoint my said
Beloved wife to Sole Executrix of this my last will and
Testament And I Do hereby Revoke all former and other
Wills by me made And Do Declare this to be my last
Witness whereof I have hereunto Set my Hand and Seal
this ninth Day of September in the Year of our Lord
God one thousand seven Hundred and fifty eight
