



Now all men by these presents that W^m William Thomas of the Parish of Sanblethian in the County of Glamorgan Esquire George Richard of the same Parish Yeoman and Tenker Morris of the same Parish Farmer

are become bound unto the Right Reverend Father in God Shute by Divine Permission Lord Bishop of Landoff in the sum of two hundred pounds good & lawful money of great Britain to be paid to the said Lord Bishop or his lawful attorney his Exors adm^r Assigns or assigns for the good & faithful payment of which sum well and truly to be made W^m W^m bind our selves and each of us jointly & severally for the whole our heirs Exors and adm^r jointly by these presents sealed with our seals and dated the twenty second Day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and seventy seven

The Condition of this obligation is such that if the above bounden William Thomas the Natural and lawful Brother and Administrator of all and singular the Goods Chattels and Credits of Nathl Thomas late of the Parish of Sanblethian in the County of Glamorgan and Diocesis of Landoff Esquire deceased

Do make a cause to be made a true and perfect Inventory of all and singular the Goods Chattels and Credits of the said deceased which have or shall come to the hands possession or knowledge of the said William Thomas or into the hands possession of any other person or persons for him and the same so made do exhibit or cause to be exhibited into the Registry of the Consistory Court of Landoff on or before the last day of July next ensuing and the same Goods Chattels Credits of the said deceased which at the time of her death or which at any time hereafter shall come to the hands and possession of the said William Thomas or into the hands and possession of any other person or persons for him do well and truly administer according to Law and further do make a cause to be made a true and perfect Account of his said Administration on or before the last day of April which will be in the year 1778 and all the rest and residue of the said Goods Chattels and Credits which shall be found remaining on the said Administrator's Account the same being first examined and allowed of by the Judge of the said Court for the time being shall deliver and pay unto such person or persons respectively as the said Judge by his decree or sentence pursuant to the true intent and meaning of an Act of Parliament (Intituled an Act for the better selling Intestate Estates) shall think and appoint and if hereafter it shall appear that any Last Will and Testament was made by the said deceased and the Exor or Exors thereof named do exhibit the same into the said Court making request to have it approved of accordingly if the said William Thomas being the Account lawfully required do render and deliver the said Letters of Administration approving of such Testament being first read and made into the said Court then this obligation to be void and of no effect a else to remain in full force and virtue
