In the name of God Amen.

I William Rosser of the parish of Llanblethian in the county of Glamorgan, yeoman, being of sound mind, memory and understanding, praise be God, do make and ordain this my last will and testament in manner following:-

I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Elinor Rosser all my worldly goods and effects both real and personal, whom I nominate and appoint sole executrix of this my last will and testament hereby revoking all former wills by one heretofore made and ordain this to be my last will and testament in witness thereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal, the twenty fifth day of March 1786.
