 Almighty god) doe make and ordaine this my last will &  
 Testament, revoking all other wills by me formerly made, in  
 manner & forme following, That is first, first I commend my soule  
 to the hands of God my maker, hoping assuredly through the  
 only merits of Iesus Christ my Saviour, to be made partaker  
 of life everlasting, and my body to the earth whereof it was  
 made, & to be buried by my executors hereinafter named  
 in decent & Christian manner. Item I give & bequeath towards  
 the reparacion of the Cathedrall Church of Landaff, I give  
 & bequeath towards the reparacion of the parish church  
 of Epswornay aforesaid, I give & will that out of the residue  
 of my estate (which god hath bestowed on me) may be paid & satisfied  
 all my debts which I am right or conscience on to any person  
 whatsoever, I give and bequeath unto my dear and  
 wellbelov'd wife <sup>Mary</sup> and to my deare next Katherine the wife  
 of Stephen Morgan of Epswornay aforesaid. All my goods  
 equally to be divided between them the said Mary & Katherine  
 And lastly I doe hereby nominate constitute ordaine & appoint  
 my said wife Mary and my said next Katherine to be my  
 executors of aswell all my personall estate, that shall be  
 over & above the paying & satisfying of my debts as aforesaid  
 as also of this my last will & Testament. In witness  
 whereof I have hereunto put my hand & seale the day  
 and year above written
