following: first I give my soule into the hands of almighty god
my maker hoping assuredly to grow y^e merits of his grace and pass
of his favour to enjoy his bliss to attain everlasting life and
my body to be buried in Christian buriall: Item I give after
the decease of my wife Mary the sum of five pound & y^e part
of the poor of y^e parish of wylke St Donatts and my will is that
stock or sum of five pound shall remain in y^e said parish for ever to
the said use: Item I give unto my wife Mary all my stock
& I give unto her during y^e life of Henkin Rowland five acres of
land in y^e parish of Bradwate and if he survive my said wife
my will is that the remainder of y^e said land shall be unto Ric^e Rowland
I give unto y^e said Henkin after my wives decease to be done
red him one standing bed, one feather bed and bolster Cu-
tained and valloined with cloath: & one table carpet and three foot
one cupboard five platters two pewter candlesticks and one of brass
one brass mortar and pestle two sawers and a bottle all now being
