Edmondess Arms built on the site, property of the Edmondess family :

1851 Mary Bevan, widow, aged 67, with daughter Jane Turbervill, 30, grandsons Daniel,
13 and Thomas, 7 *Census 182*

1861 Jane Turbervill, widow, 41, victualler, son Thomas, 17, ironmonger's assistant,
and lodger Wm John, 55 *Census 1*

1871 Jane Turbervill, 51, publican *Census 2*

1881 Jane Turbervill, 61, innkeeper
Son Thomas Turbervill, 37, commission agent *Census 171*

1891 Michael Fitzgerald, 31, licensed victualler from Cork, Ireland, with wife Johanna
Fitzgerald, 21, and sons Stephen and Frederick, plus one servant, Ann John
Census 168

1896-1906 Landlady was the grandmother of *DP Lewis of St Brides Major*, who sent a
letter to the Gem newspaper to that effect. Other information she gave : her grandfather
was the local policeman but died young. Another uncle was Harry Webb the blacksmith,
and her mother worked in a Cowbridge bank during WW1. Her aunt Florrie kept the
sweet shop (now Ogmores Vale bakers).
