

COWBRIDGE,

A small market town, in Glamorganshire, seated on the river Daw or Thawy, in a beautiful valley 12 miles from Cardiff, 33 from Swansea, and 172 from London. The neighbourhood is extremely fertile, and remarkable for a number of castles. The town consists of one street, well paved. The church is a plain structure, with a round tower; besides which there are two places of wor-ship for dissenters, and an excellent grammar school, where many literary characters have been educated, particularly the late Dr. Price. In the middle of the street stands the town-hall, where the quarter sessions are held; and a little further is the house of correction, a very neat building. The town is governed by two bailiffs, twelve aldermen, twelve common council, and sundry inferior officers. It has a good market on Tuesday. Fairs on the 1st. Tuesday in February, 25th. March, 4th. May, 24th. June, 1st. Tuesday in August, 29th. September, and 1st. Tuesday in December. It contains 165 houses and 1,107 inhabitants.
