

THE GREAT TRIANGLE.

The triangle embodies the area served by the Great Western Railway, whose train services run over about 8,690 miles of track; with some 1,500 stations and halts. To give an efficient transport service in this area 4,900 locomotives, 10,000 passenger vehicles, and 100,000 goods wagons, with a staff of 117,000 are employed. In 1924 the G. W. R. carried 140,241,113 passengers, irrespective of season ticket holders, whilst 81,723,133 tons of goods traffic and 2,674,238 head of live stock were conveyed. The Great Western Railway is the largest dock owning company in the world.
