 time of my decease shall be, and remaine in and about my house. Item I give & bequeath
 my debts and legacies paid, and paymētts discharged. All other my goods, plate, jewels
 and estate whatsoever (except my household stuff, formerly bequeath'd) in manner as
 followeth. That is to say. One equal part or halfe part thereof unto my said wife
 Elizabeth Fitzpeter. And the other moetytie or halfe part thereof unto my daughter Elizabeth
 Fitzpeter, to be paid and delivered here at the time of her marriage. And my will is
 that if my said daughter shall intermarry with any man without the approbation & consent
 of good letters of my said executor, and ever see hereafter named, and Elizabeth the wife of
 God mother unto my said daughter, that then her said portion shall come and remaine unto
 my said executor, who shall dispose thereof all his discretion. And my mind and will further
 is, that my said executor shall have and enjoy in his own hands, and custody my said
 daughter's said portion, and with the interest thereof shall mainteyn & keep
 her untill her said marriage. Any same, custom, or usage of the City of London to the con-
 trary thereof, or of any thing in this my present will contrary notwithstanding. And I
 make constitute, and ordyne my said lawfull wife Elizabeth Fitzpeter full and sole executor, of
 this my last will and testament, executors, all former, and other wills, legacies & bequestes
 by me heretofore made, made, or bequeath'd. And I constitute, and ordyne Mr. Richard
 Berne of London, merchant, executor of this my last will and testament, desiring and re-
 quyring him to be aiding and assisting unto my said executor, and to see that my will be
 executed according to my true meaning hereof, and for his part. I desire and entreat
 him to accept of my scale, signet, of gold, which I now wear, being my own with a shipp
 and to use the same in execution of this my will. **In witness** whereof I the said Henry
