 Taynton Esq. his heirs and assigns absolutely I give the following
 legacies to the children of my late Sister Robert Thomas Taynton
 namely to Harriet wife of Charles Matthew Thompson of Worcester
 in the County of Shropshire a legacy of three hundred pounds
 sterling to Eliza wife of Richard Rowland Porter of Shropshire a legacy
 of four hundred pounds sterling to Caroline wife of the Reverend James
 Curry Esq. the sum of two hundred pounds sterling to the Reverend
 William Taynton Esq. a legacy of one hundred pounds sterling and to
 Henry Taynton Surgeon a legacy of one hundred pounds sterling and
 I direct my Executor hereinafter named to pay the said legacies at the
 expiration of six months after my decease and that the legacies of such of
 the said pecuniary legacies as are married women shall be paid into their
 respective proper hands to be enjoyed and disposed of as their separate
 property far from marital control and for weirs legacies their respective
 wrights shall be sufficient directions I give to my God daughter
 Maria Ann daughter of my said Sister Harriet Thompson a
 legacy of two hundred pounds sterling payable as aforesaid mentioned
 that is to say in case of my death before my said God daughter shall
 have married or attained the age of twenty one years I direct the trustee
 and executor hereinafter appointed of this my will to stand possessed of the
 said legacy upon trust to invest the same in any name in the public
 funds or on Government securities of the United Kingdom or on real or
 securities in England or Wales with liberty to change the investment at his
 discretion for any other of the kind prescribed and to accumulate the yearly
 income by similar investments until my said God daughter shall
 attain the age of twenty one years or marry or die under that age and
 if she shall attain that age or previously marry upon either event to
 transfer to her both the original fund and the accumulations but if

that shall be under that age unmarried then it is my will that the same shall follow the continuation of the residue of my personal estate
 I direct my Executor hereinafter named to raise very handsome rings of at least five hundred value each to be given to my valued and
 dear friends General Frederick Maitland and Catherine Howard or to
 Maitland his wife of Brickley Square London and Holywell Street
 as a small testimony of my sincere regard and to show the trust & confidence
 of their many acts of friendship and kindness to me during so many years
 of my life I also give my said Executor to raise similar rings to be given
 to my valued friends Charlotte wife of Doctor Benjamin Maitland of
 Cambridge and Sarah wife of David Evans Esquire of Frankfurt or to
 Maitland's daughter as to all the residue and remainder of my
 real and personal estate whatsoever and wheresoever I give the same
 and also appoint all the real and personal estate over which I have any
 power of appointment unto my said Executor the Reverend Thomas
 Fawcett of Cambridge aforesaid Clerk his heirs executors and admuni-
 strators for his absolute benefit subject nevertheless as to so much of the
 said real and personal estate as may be voted in me as trustee or com-
