Yesterday was a day of civic pageantry in Wales, when, in keeping with municipal practice in the rest of the country, the Lord Mayor of Cardiff, and the mayors of the various boroughs in the Principality attended Divine service for the first time in their official capacity.

Bright autumn sunshine added colour to the time-honoured processions, which, in all instances, are reported as being among the largest seen for many years.
