UNTIL 1872 PARLIAMENTARY ELECTIONS HAD BEEN OPEN ELECTIONS WHERE THE VOTER HAD TO NAME THE PERSON FOR WHOM HE VOTED IN THE PRESENCE OF LOCAL OFFICERS AND AGENTS.
