Old Hall, 1762 and 1778.
Old Hall, the "Mansion House and Gardens", was the principal house in 18th. Century Cowbridge, and belonged to John Edmondes when the inventory of 1762 was taken. We do not know why this was done, and no valuation was made. It is detailed, but still omits certain rooms; thus the "office" is referred to only in relation to another room, and there is no mention of cellars or stables.

By contrast, the second inventory was taken, in 1778 , for the purpose of letting part of the house for a year. John Edmondes died in that year at the age of thirty eight, and as his sons were minors, the house seems to have been taken over by his brother, colonel Thomas Edmondes of neighbouring Llandough Castle. This inventory includes a valuation, but the furnishings are not only much sparser but actually bear little relation to those of 1762 , which suggests that Thomas must have made reductions and substitutions for letting purposes. Some things, such as the "Dutch Oak" pieces and the "Scots Carpet", were presumably regarded as inferior items. Even the names of the rooms are different, making comparisons extra hard.

The 1762 inventory reflects good living, amply provided with amenities, without grandeur. The kitchen is vastly better equipped than in the previous two dwellings, and in addition to the items of tin, pewter and brass, there are lists of china and plate. The hall furnishings suggest that it was used for dining, and the service items indicate a degree of informality. Only three bedrooms are elaborately equipped. There are some curious anomalies in the descriptions: thus "marble slobs" presumably means "marble slabs", "battle boards" may be "bottle boards", and the strange heading "On the Kitchen Chair", as if it were a separate room, may mean "On the Kitchin Stair". Possibly these are errors of dictation, since the usual method of taking inventories is for one person to call out the items while a second person writes them down. Unfortunately there are no names or signatures appended to the 1762 inventory.

* The "Brass Level with logs" in the hal is presumably a suweying instrmant, with "legs".

As well as the inventories, the style and layout of the 18 th. Century house is well shown in a small watercolour of the garden front, made in the mid 19th. Century, from which the illustration is taken, and in a survey of the interior made in the 1890s just before alterations were carried out. The names of the roomssiown are those of the survey, with the 1762 names, where known or conjectured, in brackets.

I have analysed some of the features of the two inventories, as follows:

## 1.Furniture Woods.

In contrast to the previous inventories, furniture woods are often used as a means of differentiation. Oak is referred to in several ways; thus "oak" pieces are mentioned in both inventories, "wainscoat chairs" are referred to in the 1762 kitchen, and several pieces in 1778 are "Dutch oak". This suggests that the chairs may be of the panel-back variety, since "wainscot' is not used to describe the imported wood; assuming that "Dutch oak" refers to imported timber rather than furniture. There is evidence that the family's servants were familiar with timbers, for a technical schedule exists from the 1770s, listing "Russia Deals" and other softwoods imported via Aberthaw for flooring and other joinery in Old Hall. It may be inferred that Dutch oak had been imported for the use of local furniture makers, and was recognised as such. 2. Service and Kitchen Items.

The use of the word "board" for a tray is common, but the term "handboard" ( four in the passage adjoining the hall in 1762 ) is obscure. It is interesting that there is no word for "tray" in old Welsh, and during the present century transeription the term "hambwrdd", a literal tranation of "handboard", has been coined for this purpose. The pair of "Battle boards" in the Yellow Room may refer to trays for bottles, the "Small Hand Sideboard" in the Little Parlour is probably a tray on a stand, and there is a "Pontypool Tea Board" included among the plate.

Also mentioned is a "Pontypool Waiter", presumably a small tiered stand to be placed on a table, and " 3 Small Mohogany Waiters" in the kitchen, for
delivery of self-service food to diners. In the hall also are an amazing " 7 Mohogany Stands to hold Dishes on the Table".

Warming devices are represented, in the kitchen, by a "Footman", a tablelike trivet to hold dishes before a fire, a "Copper Plate Warmer", and " 2 Twig Plate Warmers". This is an interestingly different use of the term here "twig", used to describe a basket-work device instead of a chair.

None of these items appear in the 1778 inventory, but there is an "Iron Cat" in the Great Parlour, presumably for warming food at the "Bath Stove". 3. Bedrooms.

In 1762, the Red Room, Green Room and Yellow Room were elaborately furnished. Among many items, each had a dressing-table with a "Toilet", a floor-length cloth cover. In the "Closett" there is a "Handkerchief Table", a term I have been unable to identify.

There are a further seven bedrooms, more simply furnished, presumably for children and servants. The room over the kitchen, reached by its own stair, has two beds and a store of cutlery, while in another room there is just a cradle and an "Empty chest bed", presumably a fold-away device of the "press bed"type, but lacking the bed part.

It is interesting that in all the three dwellings feather beds are ubiquitous, the "Dust Bed" in William Howards inventory being the sole exception.
