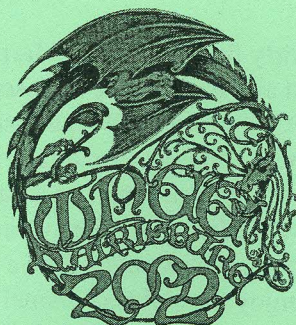

Tour Descriptions:

(T1 and T9) Gettysburg Battlefield – Only thirty five miles from Harrisburg, this tour will feature two major historic sites, the famous Civil War battlefield and the Dwight D. Eisenhower farm. Your tour guide is the son of Welsh immigrants, an expert on the Battle of Gettysburg, and a published Civil War author! Lunch will be served at the *Dobbin House Tavern*, circa 1776. Lunch, admissions and tour guide included in cost of tour.

(T2) Lancaster County & Amish Culture – See a typical Pennsylvania Dutch farm in operation and take a guided tour through an authentic Amish house. Enjoy the finest in Pennsylvania Dutch cooking by dining family style at the *Good 'N Plenty* restaurant. After lunch, stop at the *Kitchen Kettle Village*, an Amish quilt shop and farmer's market. You can shop here or just relax and enjoy the sights and smells of homemade goods, and hear the sounds of a horse and buggy as the Amish and Mennonites go about their daily routine. Lunch, admissions and tour guide included in cost of tour.

(T3 and T8) Hershey Chocolate World – This half-day tour is scheduled right in Harrisburg's backyard, the town of Hershey. Here the tourist can learn all about "The Sweetest Place on Earth", tour *Founder's Hall* (a tribute to Milton Hershey and the school he founded), visit the world famous *Hershey Chocolate Factory* and get a free sample at the end of the tour. Some may wish to stay and thrill to the rides and shows at *Hersheypark*, adjacent to the chocolate factory. Admissions and tour guide included in cost of tour.

(T4 and T6) Harrisburg Capital City – It is only natural that the host city be explored, so a guided tour of the State Capital complex, the *Pennsylvania State Museum*, *The National Civil War Museum* and other historic sites will comprise this half-day tour. Each tourist will be afforded a taste of Pennsylvania history while enjoying Harrisburg's scenic splendor. Admissions and tour guide included in cost of tour.

(T5) Welsh Heritage Tour of Delta – Our tour selection would not be complete without a tour of Delta, home of the host committee and an hour's drive south of Harrisburg on the Mason-Dixon line. Come see our Welsh heritage as it is preserved on historic Main Street (a district on the National Historic Register), the *Old Line Museum* (Welshiana, local artifacts and slate quarrying items), and *Capel Cymraeg Rehoboth*. In nearby *Coulsontown*, nineteenth century replicas of North Wales quarrymen's cottages will be seen, followed by a trip to *Slateville Cemetery* where you will see intricately carved slate gravemarkers, nearly all in Welsh, using etymology and other poetic forms. Returning back to Delta, a hot buffet luncheon will be enjoyed at *Ferranti's Italian Restaurant*. Lunch, admissions and tour guide included in cost of tour.

(T7) Longwood Gardens & Brandywine – A brand new offering is a trip to *Longwood Gardens*, "the world's premiere horticultural display." Every day of the year the gardens delight visitors with its fountains, exquisite flowers, majestic trees, and opulent architecture. Here amid 1,050 outdoor acres and 20 indoor gardens you will find beauty at every turn! Lunch will be provided at the museum's *Garden's Café*. The tour will continue on to *Brandywine Battlefield* (the American Revolution) and the *Brandywine Museum* (which houses an extensive collection of three generations of the art works of the Wyeth family.) Lunch, admissions and tour guide included in cost of tour.

As best I can tell you are correct on the \$13,395.25 deficit. This is not good to say the least There are so many things that I can not understand in the final report that to me it is of little or no value. The final report does not have any back up, a final register report by category needs to be done showing the amounts and payees of all checks issued. The totals of the two reports should be the same. We can not confirm any of the amounts billed by the hotel for Beer Liquor, wine etc as none of the attachments to the bill are signed by anyone, who check all these expenses. How can the bill be reconciled. How is the seed money going to be repaid? Where is the church collection listed? Why was \$2,505 spent on a cross? What was the \$4,929.45 for shirts and Glasses? How come the rooms for 18 people were paid for at a cost of \$7,091.51? The final report does not agree with the amounts shown in HQ,s report? I could go on and on the whole thing is one big mess to me. As yet the executive committee has not met on the reports.

Marie has had some more test and every thing has come back negative, so that is good, but the problem of the pain has not gone away so we are still checking out things. Please let Ellis look at my remarks, I have also sent a copy to Alan. Huw
